



Successful Application



Obligations (attendance is mandatory)

- participating in seminars and tutorials
- self-responsible work on substantial and organizational tasks
- participating in simulation conferences and main conference in NYC
- participating in trips to Berlin and Washington D.C.

HOW CAN I APPLY?





A CV in tabular form (one page) highlighting experience and skills relevant to the project



A letter of motivation (250-300 words) explaining your passion for global affairs, the UN and your desire to participate in NMUN



An essay (300-400 words) addressing the following topic: "The implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework"

HOW CANIAPPLY?





Essay Topic: "The Implementation of the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework"

- Take the position of a representative of Sweden in the UN Environment Assembly (UNEA) and present your ideas accordingly
- 1st paragraph: Description of the problem/purpose of the agreement
- 2nd paragraph: What has Sweden already done in this context?
- 3rd paragraph: What are 3 suggestions to address the problem on a global level?

HOW CANIAPPLY?





Formatting requirements (motivation letter and essay):

- Font size: 12
- Font: Times New Roman
- Line spacing: single
- Margins: 3 cm



All documents must be submitted in English!

overall approx. 700,- (paid in advance) + flight (self-responsible booking)

- The project costs cover accommodation at all conferences and excursions,
 conference participation fees, train and bus travel



CAN I EARN ECTS FOR THE PROJECT?

yes, you can either attain 6 or 8 ECTS

- 6 ECTS: Mid-Term Exam and active participation
- 8 ECTS: Mid-Term Exam and additional research paper
